An apprenticeship is a combination of on-the-job training in the workplace, and classroom or workshop based learning at college. It will provide you with job-specific skills for your chosen career, a wage, a nationally recognised qualification that is related to the job and the opportunity to improve your English, maths and ICT skills.



YOUR QUESTIONS ANSWERED

Q: HOW OLD DO YOU HAVE TO BE?

A: You need to be at least 16 years old when you start your apprenticeship. There's no upper age limit - an adult can train as an apprentice too.

Q: HOW MUCH WILL I EARN?

A: The current minimum wage for an apprentice is £3.70* per hour but employers can, and often do, pay more. This rate applies to all apprentices in their first year. After year one, all apprentices are entitled to the National Living or National Minimum Wage according to their age.

Q: WHAT ARE THE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS?

A: You may need up to five GCSEs at grade (9-4) A* to C - including English and Maths. Entry requirements vary between individual apprenticeships. Please see detailed course information on our website.

Q: WHERE WILL MY APPRENTICESHIP BE BASED?

A: The majority of apprenticeships are based in the workplace and include one day a week at college, however some are 100% work-based. Please see individual course information on our website

Q: WHAT SUPPORT DO APPRENTICES RECEIVE?

A: As an apprentice you will receive support from your employer, your lecturers and assessors at college. You will also have a dedicated staff member who will visit you in the workplace to support your progress both at college and at work.

Q: HOW MUCH WILL IT COST?

A: As an apprentice your training won't cost you anything. However, you may want to buy books and stationery to support your learning.

Q: WHERE DO I START WHEN SEARCHING FOR AN APPRENTICESHIP AND JOB VACANCY?

A: Our Apprenticeship Team will support you in choosing the right apprenticeship, and can also help you to find a relevant job - they have vacancies waiting! Our Careers Team can help you with CV writing and job applications.

Q: I'VE ALREADY GOT A JOB, CAN I STILL BE AN APPRENTICE?

A: Definitely - if your employer agrees you can become an apprentice in your current workplace. Contact our Apprenticeship Team for more information, or your employer can do this directly.

Q: WILL I GET HOLIDAY PAY?

A: You will be entitled to the same conditions as other employees working at similar grades or in similar roles, including paid annual leave, sick pay and company benefits.

Q: HOW LONG DOES AN APPRENTICESHIP TAKE?

A: It will depend on the individual apprenticeship, however all apprentices have to be in training for a minimum of 12 months.
















APPRENTICESHIP LEVELS ≺←

The table below shows apprenticeship levels and the equivalent qualification alternatives.

	Level	Equivalent Educational Level
INTERMEDIATE	2	5 GCSE passes at grades (9-4) A* to C
ADVANCED	3	2 A level passes
HIGHER	4, 5, 6 and 7	Foundation degree and above



If you like the sound of an apprenticeship but would like to get more experience first, then a traineeship could be a great starting point for you - they are designed to prepare young people for the world of work, and are a great stepping stone between leaving school and applying for an apprenticeship.

Traineeships are available in many industry areas, and are completed over a flexible period of six weeks to six months - split between college attendance and work experience. They are available for 16-24 year olds, with qualifications lower than Level 3.







PROGRESSION AND PROMOTION

- Aim high!

Employers are keen to grow their own talent by training apprentices using their tried and tested business methods. Showing the ability to work and study often helps apprentices to stand out from other employees, meaning an apprenticeship could provide you with an excellent progression path.

- Over 90% of apprentices currently go into work or further training.*
- \rightarrow Higher apprentices could earn £150,000 more on average over their lifetime compared to those with Level 3 vocational qualifications.*


















HOW TO BECOME AN apprentice

Are you currently employed?

You can train through an apprenticeship with your current employer and base your training around your current job role. You need to be working within a relevant industry for a minimum of 30 hours per week, however terms are becoming more flexible.

You can contact our Apprenticeship Team yourself for more information, or your employer can do this directly.

Are you looking for a job?

You will need to find a suitable apprenticeship job within a relevant industry, ideally for a minimum of 30 hours per week. Our Apprenticeship Team can match you to their existing employer vacancies, and will give you information about the training and qualification.
